The March of the Crows will proceed outside with a new route if the weather permits. It will begin at the Confederation Centre of he Arts Amphitheatre, proceed along Victoria Row, turn right on to the sidewalk, and then turn right again to go up the stairs to the Confederation Centre Plaza and finish at the door of the 'old' Library on the Plaza.

There will be a further announcement later today should there be any refinements to locations or the rain plan.
